
Lilian Wolfe was born on December 22, 1875, in London. Hired by the General Post Office, she became a member




Having joined the Women's Freedom League but considering granting women the right to vote as a mere « palliative », she joined the anarchist movement in 1913. She participated in the revival of



Thomas Keell, the typesetter and editor of the anarchist newspaper Freedom, became her







Until Thomas Keell's death on June 26, 1938, she lived at Whiteway Colony in the « guiding light of Leo Tolstoy ».



Still active, she was the managing director of the Freedom Press bookstore, a position she held until the age of 95. A member of the National Council for Civil Liberties and War Resisters International, she died of a stroke on April 22, 1974.
